**Shuss**

**Grenoble 1968**

Shuss is a little man on skis and features the Olympic Rings.



**Schneemandl**

**Innsbruck 1976**

"Schneemandl" translates to "snowman" in English.



**Roni**

**Lake Placid 1980**

The raccoon is common to the Adirondack region.



**Vučko**

**Sarajevo 1984**

The wolf is a popular figure in Yugoslavian fables.



**Hidy & Howdy**

**Calgary 1988**

These mascots are polar bears which represent the Arctic regions.



**Magique**

**Albertville 1992**

Magique is in the shape of a star to symbolize dreams and imagination.



**Haakon & Kristin**

**Lillehammer 1994**

The names refer to 13th century historical figures in Norway's regions.



**Sukki, Nokki, Lekki, & Tsukki**

**Nagano 1998**

Also called the "Snowlets" to represent winter and the world coming together.

**Coal, Powder, & Copper**  
*Salt Lake City 2002*

The mascots are a nod to Utah's landscape.



**Neve & Gliz**  
*Turin 2006*

Neve is a snowball and Gliz is an ice cube.



**Quatchi & Miga**  
*Vancouver 2010*

Quatchi is a Sasquatch and Miga is a Sea Bear, a nod to the tales of the First Nation in Canada.



**Hare, Leopard, & Polar Bear**  
*Sochi 2014*

The three mascots represent the three places on the Olympic podium.



**Soohorang**  
*PyeongChang 2018*

The white tiger is considered the guardian animal of Korea.



**Bing Dwen Dwen**  
*Beijing 2022*

This panda wears a shell of ice that allows it to compete alongside the athletes.
